# "THE ASSURANCE OF FAITH IN A WORLD OF DOUBT" 1 John 5:13-21 (Part Three)

Christians can rest in the truths that we can know <u>that</u> we have eternal life, <u>that</u> we can know that God answers prayer, <u>that</u> we can know victory over sin, <u>that</u> we can know we belong to God, and that we can know what is true.

### I. Faith Furnishes Confidence. 5:13

Believing God's witness to His Son gives a sure foundation so that we can know that we have eternal life.

## II. Faith Enables Prayer. 5:14-17

As believers we have confidence that God will answer our prayers, if we pray according to His will.

- A. The General Principle: If we ask anything according to God's will, He hears and grants our requests. 14-15
  - When we pray, God hears us and we have the requests that we ask of Him. But ... We must ask according to God's will.
- B. The Specific Example: We should pray for God to give life to those who are in sin. 16-17
  - If we pray for a person who is not committing a sin unto death, God will give life to him. But ... The promise does not apply to a person committing a sin unto death.

### III. Faith Grants Understanding. 5:18-21

Because of what we know about our relationship with God, we must guard ourselves from idols.

- A. The Christians' Victory: We know that no one who is born of God lives in sin. 18
- B. The Christians' Identity: We know that we are of God, in contrast to the world that lies in the power of the evil one.
- C. The Christians' Understanding: We know that the Son of God has come & given us understanding to know the true God. 20
- D. The Christians' Charge: As God's little children, we must guard ourselves from idols. 21

## What Can We Take Away from 1 John?

- 1. The Christian message concerns the claims that Christ made regarding Himself and was passed on by the apostles and centuries of Christ-followers down to today.
- 2. Faith, and faith alone, without human merit is the proper and only true response to the revelation of God's mercies in and through Jesus Christ.
- 3. It is possible on several counts to know that we have entered into the life of God.
- 4. God desires us to firmly know and rejoice in the fact that we are securely under His protection and that He will bring all of His children into His presence.
- 5. John reminds us that we live in a world of false values perpetuated by twisted truths.
- 6. False teachers are going about with their false understandings of Christ and His accomplishments, and their pleasant words and promises entangle many.
