Those who truly love and follow Jesus Christ must not fall in love with the things of this world, but rather with the Father who gives them everything they need.

### I. KNOW WHAT YOU ARE IN CHRIST AND CANNOT LOSE.

1 John 2:12-14 (An Aside About the Church)

Wherever you are at in your Christian walk, God wants you to be encouraged by His grace so that you will grow more.

- A. Little Children: You are forgiven!
  This is the foundation!
- B. Fathers: You know the Father! This is the goal!
- C. Young Men: You are victors in the faith!
  This is the means!

#### II. KNOW WHAT THE WORLD OFFERS BUT CANNOT GIVE.

1 John 2:15-17 (An Aside About the World)

You must choose your love and then maintain your choice: You love either the world or the Father, but not both.

A. The Command. 2:15

The world cannot give you what you need.

The "world": A system of values that is opposed to God and that characterizes those who reject Him.

B. The Cause. 2:16

# The world cannot give you what it promises.

- 1. Desires of the flesh appeal to our appetites.
- 2. Desires of the eyes appeal to our affections.
- 3. Pride in possessions appeals to our ambitions
- C. The Consequence. 2:17

The world cannot give you what will last.

#### EVALUATE WHETHER YOU LOVE THE WORLD OR THE FATHER

- ✓ What do I seek with more favor: the wealth and honors of the world, or the riches of grace and the approval of God?
- ✓ Which has the greater attraction: the pleasures of the world, which are only for a season, or those pleasures at God's right hand, which are for eternity?
- ✓ Wherein lies my confidence: in the money I have in my bank accounts or investments, or in the living and faithful God, who has promised to supply all my needs?
- ✓ What causes the deeper sorrow: a temporal loss, or a break in my fellowship with God?
- ✓ Upon which do I get more joy: spending money for personal comforts and luxuries, or investing money to further the gospel?
- ✓ What most dominates my mind: thoughts and schemes after worldly advancements, or resolutions and efforts to grow in grace and in the knowledge of the Lord?

# QUESTIONS FOR CONSIDERATION/DISCUSSION 1 John 2:15-17

- What are some ways that worldliness is often misunderstood? How should we understand worldliness, biblically?
- Why does John not give us the option, which seems possible, to be partially committed both to God and to the world?
- Does "not loving the world" mean that it is wrong for a Christian to seek to succeed in business or a career? Why or why not?
- How can we who live in affluence (compared to much of the world) know when enough is enough? How do we choose a permissible level of luxury?
- What are some things we need as God's image-bearers that the world cannot provide?
- Why are asceticism and isolationism not the ways to godliness? What are the dangers of these approaches?
- What are "values"? How are a person's values revealed?
- How does loving the world decrease our capacity for loving God?
- Why do people often choose to love the world? Why do people hesitate to do the will of God?
